Pavilion

You may have seen in the local village news that the Parish Council and looking to redevelop the pavilion. The pavilion sits on our school field but belongs to the Parish Council. Because of this, the Governors and I have been working directly with Suffolk County Council to find a solution that works for the school and allows the Parish Council access to the Pavilion without compromising the safety of our pupils. For this to happen we have agreed to give a strip of land allowing the parish council direct access to the pavilion meaning we will lose our current entrance to the field. Once the new fence has been erected, the children will access the field from the school playground behind the pavilion. There will only be a minimal loss of field space for our pupil. This has been agreed by Suffolk County Council. More information will be provided by the Parish Council. As soon as we know when work starts, we will let you know.
